














Four rock pools to splash in this summer

ROCK pools are like nature's playpen, a huge drawcard for kids jot all ages) and those who prefer something more contained than the big wide ocean. The Hawarra is spoilt for choice when it comes to stunning options: Here are a handful to get you started.

Blowhole Point Rock Pool A great place for the entire family, the

irregular-shaped pool has various depths and a natural rock floor. A shallow wading area on one slide is suitable for young children

On the north side of Kiama's Blowhole Point, you can access the pool from Blowhole Point Road. There is plenty of parking, logether with picric tables and change rooms nearby.

Austinmer Rock Pools


